CHALLENGE TO TEST QUICKEST MODES OF TRANSPORT

Ready, set, go commuters are racing to town

traffic on your way to work wondering if there is a quicker way to get there?

If so, Luton Council are testing the quickest methods of transport in a commuter challenge on Friday, October 22.

The challenge will involve a group of walkers, two cyclists, one bus passenger and two car drivers making their way to work to see what transport method is the quickest.

It will start at 8.15am at the Homebase roundabout in Barton Road, with contestants following the A6 into Luton town centre with one cyclist using the road and the other taking the off-road cycle route. The finishing line will be placed at the steps of the Town Hall.

Part of the car drivers' challenge will be to find suitable parking near the town centre.

Councillor Dave Taylor said: "Many people believe that driving to work is the fastest way of get-ting there. In many cases though, this is not true. "Waiting in traffic during rush

hour, and searching for a parking space, all adds extra time to your journey, problems which cyclists and walkers do not face.

"Another common myth is that walking to work takes far longer than driving. With the commuter challenge we are hoping to show

people that walking does not take as long as they may think, and can be very enjoyable

"I would encourage everyone to ask themselves whether they can change the way they travel to

Highlights and results from the challenge will be revealed by the Town Hall's sustainable travel team at a stand in The Mall Lu-ton during Energy Saving Week on October 29. There will also be a smarter driving simulator showing drivers how economical they are behind the wheel, with advisors showing people how to reduce their carbon emissions.
